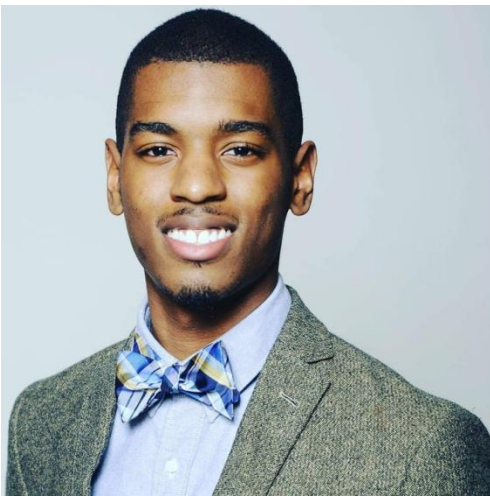


# Doug Peters
